



From Iloilo in the West to Davao in the South

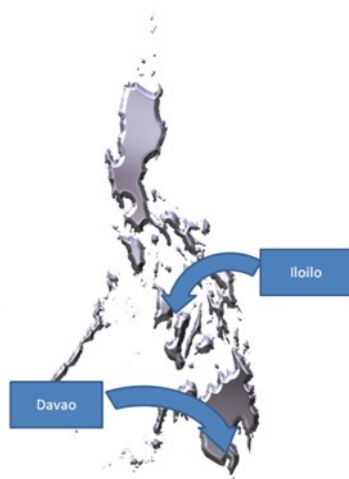
